"Anyone who believes in me," shouted Jesus in a loud voice, "doesn't believe in me, but in the one who sent me! Anyone who sees me sees the one who sent me! **I've come into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me won't need to stay in the dark.** If anyone hears my words and doesn't keep them, I'm not going to judge them. That wasn't why I came. **I came to save the world, not to judge it.** Anyone who rejects me and doesn't hold on to my words has a judge. The word which I have spoken will judge them on the last day. I haven't spoken on my own authority. The Father who sent me gave me his own command about what I should say and speak. **And I know that his command is the life of the coming age.** What I speak, then, is what the Father has told me to speak." (John 12:44-50, The Kingdom NT, emphasis added)

The passage(s) we will be focusing on today come directly after this teaching by Jesus. When you read these passages with God at the forefront and everyone else behind, what do you see? A preacher railing against the atrocities of the day? A social warrior determined to pass legislation to ease the burden of His fellow citizens? Or do you see a Savior, desperate to save those who would do Him harm? A loving God who has, time and time again, provided a path to forgiveness for those who would turn from darkness to light?

I hope we all read our passage(s) of study today and see how great and wonderful the love of our God truly is.
