There are lyrics to a song by the group Casting Crowns that stick in my mind when I evaluate who I am and what I am aiming at in my life:

"Just to know You and
 To make You known
 We lift Your name on High
 Shine like the sun make darkness run and hide
**We know we were made for so much more
 Than ordinary lives
 It's time for us to more than just survive
 We were made to thrive"**

When the writers wrote those lyrics, I can only imagine the aim of a challenge like that. It is so easy in the world that we live to simply exist, survive, get by, etc. However, God did not call His people to simply be ordinary in a world of ordinary -- "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship (rational service). Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2)

God has called His people to stand out, stand up, and take a stand against the world's temptations and distractions. The questions asked in today's lesson come from an in-depth reading of Paul's first letter to a young preacher named Timothy. Paul fully expected (and I feel he demanded) Timothy to teach the things he wrote to the local church. If we are expected to act and represent ourselves a certain way as the Lord's church, then I would suggest we consistently self-evaluate to make sure we are pleasing in the eyes of God.

These next two weeks are intended to be a challenge to every person who calls themselves a member of the Lord's church. If you find yourself immediately defensive or refusing to honestly self-evaluate, please allow the Word of God to work on your heart as this is a test we cannot afford to fail. -SW
