THIS MORNING -- We have spent a considerable amount of time in these first two months examining our example, our influence, our evidence of change, and our attitude towards spiritual growth. In so doing, it has caused all of us (I hope) to take stock of our faith journey and in honesty, make the necessary changes to correct or continue the behavior.

When we talk about correcting behavior, we have to first be willing to agree upon the standard by which we will be grading the behavior. This is why we have zeroed in on First Thessalonians as a letter to hold up as a mirror. This letter gives great insight into what it means to hold foundationally to faith and refuse to compromise even when the noise around you gets loud. As we look at chapter four today, we will see Paul explaining why this type of honest correction is necessary and why we must remain steadfast until death.

"Finally, then, brothers, we ask and urge you in the Lord Jesus, that as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God, just as you are doing, that you do so more and more." From verse 1 forward in this chapter, Paul teaches and commands that those who have lost their way must correct it and those who are doing the will of God must continue in it steadfastly.

We all have a 'why' for our lives and if it isn't clear, then I pray it will become clear after our study this morning.
