Agnostic for most of his life, Malcolm Muggeridge became a Protestant Christian, publishing *Jesus Rediscovered* in 1969, a collection of essays, articles and sermons on faith, which became a best seller. *Jesus: The Man Who Lives* followed in 1976, which was a more substantial work describing the gospel in his own words.

Perhaps you have never been tempted to believe that the world we live in came from anywhere other than God Almighty. However, you should be informed that there is a significant portion of our world's population that fully embrace the absence of God in the existence of the world. In so doing, what many will attempt to say is that this world came about through a series of events that cannot be duplicated and that resulted in life beginning from nothing. How could this happen? The answers seem to escape even the brightest atheistic minds.

In April of 1966, Time Magazine asked "Is God Dead?" and a large portion of this country bristled at the question. How would you respond today concerning the living proof of God's existence or could you have the conversation with someone today? We pray that our study this morning will be encouraging to you and challenging to the world that desires to live without acknowledging the true Creator.
