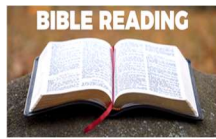

Today's Reading – Genesis 12:1–20; 16:1–18:15 & Genesis 27
Jacob

Jacob's life began with a struggle. As a twin in the womb with Esau, he jostled for position and was born grasping his brother's heel. Jacob's name is translated as "he deceives" (Genesis 25:26). When his mother, Rebekah, asked God during her pregnancy what was happening to her, God told her there were two nations within her womb who would become divided. One would be stronger than the other, and the older would serve the younger (Genesis 25:23).

Although Jacob was in many ways the most illustrious of the Patriarchs, and the one who gave his name to Israel, it cannot be denied that in some respects he was the least attractive of them all. The mention of his name reminds us of his meanness and selfishness and the complexity of his personality.

In these short paragraphs a valuable lesson is being presented. There are times when all of us feel unworthy of the blessings that come down from the Father. However, when we look at the faithful biblical characters listed in Hebrews 11, we can draw strength and encouragement. These studies should renew our resolve to live for Jesus knowing that He will forgive us if we are faithful to Him and His Word and if we make every effort to bring honor to His name.
