In October of 2025, Tucker and I traveled to Washington, D.C. with the 8th grade class from Mars Hill Bible School. While the trip involved a lot of walking, a lot of stopping and listening, and numerous bus rides, there were multiple experiences that stuck with me. One such instance shocked me to my core and made me completely reconsider the legacy I wanted to leave behind.

While walking through the Holocaust Museum, I noticed a lot of writing on the windows in a handful of pass-throughs from one exhibit to another. I finally stopped and spent some time reading the plaque that accompanied each section of these windowpanes.

"These are the names of towns and villages where Jewish communities once lived. Most of these communities were destroyed during the Holocaust."

This statement sent a shudder down my spine as I realized its significance. Over 1,000 towns are listed on these windows and while it tugged at my emotions to consider the catastrophic loss represented here, I also could not help but think about how those town names were constant reminders to every visitor of the brevity of life and the survival of a legacy. While these people were horrifically treated, taken away from their families, and ultimately died due to the wickedness of others, their town names stand as a legacy of those who proudly stood for their faith even in the midst of that terror.

While we do not suffer that type of persecution, hate, and fear, it is sad to think that many of us will sacrifice our faith at the slightest inconvenience, frustration, or request for help. What will people think of us 75+ years from now? People of faith or people who abandoned ship at the drop of a hat?
